

## CHAPTER CXXXV.

*AN ACT*

For the relief of the late State Treasurer.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to William Findlay, late Treasurer of this Commonwealth, the sum of six hundred and ninety dollars, as an indemnification for the receipt of counterfeit bank notes, and other mistakes incident to said office.*

## CHAPTER CXXXVI.

*A SUPPLEMENT*

To an act, entitled “An act to provide for selling the several reserved tracts of land adjoining the towns of Erie, Franklin, Warren and Waterford,” and for other purposes therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the time required by the proviso contained in the third section of an act of assembly, entitled “An act to provide for selling the several reserved tracts of land adjoining the towns of Erie, Franklin, Warren and Waterford,” passed the eleventh day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, for making settlement, improvement and residence thereon, be and the same is hereby extended until*

Time required for making settlement, &c. extended to 1st April, 1824.
