CHAPTER CXXXVII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to enable the Governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road from the court house in the borough of Lewistown, to Alexander Reed's in Kishacoquillas valley.

SECT. 1.
