CHAPTER CLI.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act regulating banks."

CHAPTER CLII.

AN ACT

Authorising John Daily, guardian of Margaret and Ann Thompson, minor children of Mathew Thompson, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That John Daily, guardian of Margaret and Ann Thompson, minor children of Mathew Thompson, deceased, be, and he is hereby authorised to sell in such way as he may think most advantageous, and for the best price he may be able to obtain, a small messuage or tract of land situate in

Elizabeth township, Allegheny county, bounded by lands of Mathew M'Kennie, Joseph Cook and others, containing ninety-four acres, be the same more or less with the appurtenances thereto belonging, and to make and execute a deed of conveyance for the same, which contract, agreement and deed of conveyance made by the said John Daily by virtue of this act, shall be as good and available in law to all intents and purposes, as if the same had been done by the said Mathew Thompson in his lifetime: Provided, That the said John Daily, before he proceeds to sell and convey the property afore-Provisosaid, shall enter into recognizance with sufficient security, before the orphans? court of the proper county, for the faithful performance of the duties and powers hereby required and

SECT. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the township of Canaan, in the county of Wayne, Canaan, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof Wayne counshall hold their general elections at the house of John Fobes, Esquire, in said township.
