CHAPTER CLIII.

AN ACT

Establishing and altering certain Election Districts.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the township of Middletown, in the county of Susquehanna, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of county. Philo Bostwick in said township. Township of Middletown, Susquehanna

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-said,* That the township of Salem, in the county of Wayne, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the school house near William Woodbridge's in said township. Salem, Wayne county

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-said,* That the township of Canaan, in the county of Wayne, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of John Fobes, Esquire, in said township. Canaan, Wayne county

- 5th election district, Lycoming county. **SECT. 4.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing within the bounds of the fifth election district, in the county of Lycoming, shall hold their general elections at the house of Sarah Huckell in said township.
- Clearfield, Butler county. **SECT. 5.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Clearfield, in the county of Butler, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of John M'Coy in said township.
- Caernarvan, Berks county. **SECT. 6.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Caernarvan, in the county of Berks, shall hold their general elections at the house of Thomas L. Jones, in Morgantown, in said township.
- Kittaning, Armstrong county. **SECT. 7.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Kittaning, in the county of Armstrong, shall hold their elections at the courthouse in said county.
- Connemaugh Somerset county. **SECT. 8.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Connemaugh, in the county of Somerset, shall hold their general elections at the house of Jacob Brubaker in said township.
- Ury's district, Washington county. **SECT. 9.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing in the district called "Ury's district," in Washington county, shall hold their general elections in the house now occupied by Daniel M'Gogin, in West Middleton, in said district.
- Whiteley, Greene county. **SECT. 10.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Whiteley, in the county of Greene, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Nathaniel Campbell in said township.
- Bald Eagle, Centre county. **SECT. 11.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Bald Eagle, in the county of Centre, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Hugh White in said township.
- Lemarre, Centre county. **SECT. 12.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Lemarre, in the county of Centre, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of James Brown in said township.
- Moreland, Lycoming county. **SECT. 13.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Moreland, in the county of Lycoming, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of John Shipman in said township.
- Auburn and Springville, **SECT. 14.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the townships of Auburn and Springville, in the county of Susquehanna, shall compose a separate election

district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Salmon Thomas. Susquehanna county.

SECT. 15. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Kingston, in the county of Luzerne, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Philip Myers in said township. Kingston, Luzerne county.

SECT. 16. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Blakely, in the county of Luzerne, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of George Harbarger in said township. Blakely, Luzerne county.

SECT. 17. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all that part of Washington township, in the county of Indiana, that lies within the following boundaries, viz: Beginning at the place where M'Kee's road intersects the Kittaning road near James Thompson's dwelling house, thence along said road to M'Kee's mill, thence along the old Mahoning road to William Patterson's house, and from thence to Robert Walker's house on the purchase line, thence along said line to the line of Armstrong county, thence along said line to where it intersects the Kittaning road, thence along said road to the place of beginning, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Francis Fairman in said district. Certain parts of Washington township, Indiana county.

SECT. 18. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Pike, in the county of Bradford, shall hold their general elections at the house of Cornwall Brush in said township. Pike,

And the electors in the township of Wyalusing, in the county of Bradford, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of John Stalford in said township. Wyalusing and

And the electors in the township of Smithfield, in the county of Bradford, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the congregational meeting house in said township. Smithfield, Bradford county.

SECT. 19. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Covington, in the county of Clearfield, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Hugh Biddle, Esquire, in said township. Covington, Clearfield county.

SECT. 20. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all that part of East Nottingham township, in the county of Chester, lying south of the Nottingham road, shall be separated from the sixth and attached to the twelfth election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house of Allen F. Cunningham, New London cross roads. East Nottingham, Chester county.

SECT. 21. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Rockland, in the county of Venango, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of James Crawford in said township. Rockland, Venango county.

Mount Pleasant, Wayne county. **SECT. 22.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Mount Pleasant, in the county of Wayne, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Sanford Clark in said township.

Brokenstraw, Warren county. **SECT. 23.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Brokenstraw, in the county of Warren, who formerly elected at the house of Arthur Randles, shall hold their general elections at the house of Amasa Ransom in the said township.

Madison, Columbia county. **SECT. 24.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Madison, in the county of Columbia, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house of William Marshal in said township.

District, Berks county. **SECT. 25.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of District, in the county of Berks, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of John Wellar in said township.

Hellam, York county. **SECT. 26.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Hellam, in the county of York, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Peter Kline in said township.

Conewago, York county. **SECT. 27.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Conewago, in the county of York, shall be attached to the first election district of said county, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the court house in the borough of York in said county.

Tinicum, Bucks county. **SECT. 28.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Tinicum, in the county of Bucks, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Peter Barnets in said township.

Nockamixon, Bucks county. **SECT. 29.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Nockamixon, in the county of Bucks, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of John Buck in said township.

Ohio, Beaver county. **SECT. 30.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Ohio, in the county of Beaver, shall hold their general elections at the house of Andrew Carothers in said township.

Pimatuning, Mercer county. **SECT. 31.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Pimatuning, in the county of Mercer, shall hold their general elections at the house of Samuel Clark in said township.

Buffaloe, Cumberland county. **SECT. 32.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Buffaloe, in the county of Cumberland, shall hold their general elections at the house of Frederick Deal in said township.

SECT. 33. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Moore, in the county of Northampton, shall hold their general elections at the house of John Stehley in said township. Moore, Northampton county.

SECT. 34. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That that part of Hamilton and Peters townships, in the county of Franklin, beginning at the house of Patrick McDowell, (so as to include the same) from thence a straight course to Clapsadle's mill to the Antrim township line, thence along the same to the great road leading from Greencastle to Christman and Krider's mill, thence a straight course to Back creek, opposite William Templeton's dwelling house, thence up the said creek to the mouth of Dennin's run, thence up the same run to the road leading from the widow Armstrong's house to the Chambersburg road, thence up said road to the division line between the lands of the said widow Armstrong and Thomas M'Kinstry's, thence to the Mettle township line, thence with the same so far that a due south course will strike the place of beginning, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Michael Sellers, in the town of St. Thomas, in Peter's township. Parts of Hamilton and Peters townships, Franklin county.

SECT. 35. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Frankford road from the stone bridge across the Cohocksink creek, in the township of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, thence by the said road to the northern boundary of the said township, shall be the line for dividing the unincorporated part of the said township into two districts. And all that part of the said township between the river Delaware and the aforesaid division line, shall be called "The Eastern District," and the remaining part thereof shall be called "The Western District." And in conducting the elections for the said districts and receiving the votes at the same, the inspectors for each district shall occupy one window of the house where the election shall be holden; and no inspector shall receive any vote but from electors who shall reside within the district for which such inspector shall be chosen; and the electors of each of the said districts shall annually elect the same number of assessors, as by the fourth section of the act, entitled "An act to raise county rates and levies," passed the eleventh day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, is directed for the several wards in the city of Philadelphia, and also two inspectors for the general elections, any thing in any law to the contrary notwithstanding. SECT. 36. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Louisville, in the county of Susquehanna, be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Allen Upson in said township. Louisville township, Susquehanna county.

SECT. 37. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the borough of Orwigsburg, in the county of Schuylkill, shall vote separate from the township of Brunswick, and shall hold their general elections at the court house in said borough.

SECT. 38. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Mahoning, in the county of Indiana, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Christian Bare in said township.

SECT. 39. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all that part of Centre county, lying north of the highest ridge of Brush mountain, and east of the line of Walker township, be a separate election district, and the electors of said district shall hold their general elections at the house of Anthony Kleckner in Sugar Valley.

SECT. 40. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the townships of Pocono and Stroud, in the county of Northampton, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Michael Keener, in Stroudsburg, in Stroud township aforesaid.

Certain parts
of Buffaloe

SECT. 41. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all the following described parts of the townships of Buffaloe and Sugar Creek, in the county of Armstrong, situate between the following described line and the Allegheny river, viz: Beginning at the mouth of Glade run in the township of Buffaloe, from thence to the place where the line between the said townships crosses the said run, and from thence to Cummin's rock on the Allegheny river, shall and is hereby annexed to Kittaning township in said county, for the purpose of holding their general elections; and so much of an act, entitled "An act to regulate the general elections within this commonwealth," passed the fifteenth day of February, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, as directs that where several parts of townships shall form an election district, that the citizens of each part of such townships shall choose one inspector, is, so far as it relates to the aforesaid division, repealed.

SECT. 44. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the sixth election district in Chester county, composed of the townships of East Nantnel, Coventry and Vincent, shall hereafter hold their general elec-

tions at the public house of John Everhart, in the village of Chester Pughtown, in the township of Coventry. Chester county.

SECT. 45. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Hatfield, in the county of Montgomery, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John Buchammer in said township. Hatfield, Montgomery county.

SECT. 46. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of Brighton township, in the county of Beaver, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by David Eaken in said township. Brighton, Beaver county.

SECT. 47. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the ninth election district, in the county of Huntingdon, shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Thomas Johnston in the township of Antis. 9th district, Huntingdon county.

SECT. 48. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Cousawago, in the county of Crawford, (with the exception of two ranges of tracts off the west end of said township,) shall be an election district, and the electors thereof shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Thomas Potter in said township. Cousawago Crawford county.

SECT. 49. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of any act or acts as is by this act altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed. Repeal.

CHAPTER CLIV.

AN ACT

To compel assignees to settle their accounts, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, in all cases where any person or persons have heretofore made or execu-
