## CHAPTER CLVII.

## AN ACT

To enable Aliens to purchase and hold real estates within this Commonwealth.

Sport. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the came, That from and after the passing of this act, it shall and Aliensexcept may be lawful for all and every foreigner and foreigners, alien in certain carrier or aliens, not being the subject or subjects of some sovereign ses, allowed state or power which is or shall be at the time or times of such and hold 5000 purchase or purchases at war with the United States of Ameraces of land ica, to purchase lands, tenements and hereditaments within this commonwealth, not exceeding five thousand acres, and to have and to hold the same to them, their heirs and assigns forever, as fully to all intents and purposes as any natural born citizen or citizens may or can do.

the time they purchased the same.

SECT. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-said, That in all cases where aliens have purchased real es-Sales by tate within this commonwealth and have sold the same, the aliens consaid sales shall be valid to all intents and purposes, and shall firmed be construed to vest the title to the said real estate, as fully and effectually as if the said aliens had been citizens at the time of purchasing the same; and in all cases where any alien &c. by resideng in this commonwealth, who shall have purchased or dent aliens held real estate therein, and shall have died without having confirmed to been naturalized, the title thereof is hereby confirmed to his their heirs in heirs, who, in case he had been a citizen, would have inheri-certain cases ted the same, and there shall be no escheat by reason of such alienage: Provided, That nothing herein contained shall in Proviso, any wise affect or impair the vested rights of other individual or individuals.
