CHAPTER CLXVIII.

AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Christian Pemberton of the city of Philadelphia, to Charles Kean of Washington county, to Adam Anderson of Westmoreland county, John Carey of Northampton county, William M. Gredy of Crawford county, and John Jemison of Butler county, severally forty dollars immediately and forty dollars annually during life, to be paid half yearly, to commence the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighteen to be paid to them or their order. Grant to certain persons of \$40, and an annuity of \$40 during life.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to the heirs or legal representatives of captain John Brady, late of Northumberland county, deceased, the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars in lieu of a donation tract of land numbered one hundred and eighty two, situate within the triangular tract of land on lake Erie, formerly supposed to be in the tenth donation district, containing five hundred acres: *Provided,* That the heirs of the deceased release to the commonwealth all the right and title that they have or have had to the aforesaid five hundred acres of land at the time of passing this act, or at any time before the passage thereof. \$750 to be paid to captain John Brady in lieu of donation. Proviso.

Annuity made payable to John Haskins instead of Thomas Baird.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the act, entitled "An act for the relief of John Haskins and Daniel Dougherty, old soldiers," passed the tenth day of March eighteen hundred and twelve, as authorises the payment of the annuity (therein granted to the said John Haskins) to Thomas Baird of Allegheny county, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and the annuity aforesaid shall hereafter be paid to the said John Haskins or his order.

§ 75 granted to captain John Brisben, and an annuity of § 75 during life.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to captain John Brisben of Dauphin county, or order, seventy-five dollars immediately after the passage of this act, and an annuity of seventy-five dollars during life to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.

Accounts of William Ross to be adjusted and paid.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accountant officers of this commonwealth be, and they are hereby authorised and required to settle and adjust the accounts of William Ross, for arrearages of pay and rations due to him for his services in performing a tour of military duty during the late war, and that the treasurer is hereby authorised and required to pay the amount so found due.
