

## CHAPTER III.

*A SUPPLEMENT*

To an act, entitled "An act to erect the town of Berwick, in the counties of Columbia and Luzerne, into a borough."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the electors of the borough of Berwick, in the counties of Columbia and Luzerne, shall hold their borough election the last Tuesday in March in each and every year, and shall elect two reputable citizens of said borough, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of the county of Columbia, one of whom shall be appointed constable of said borough, in the same manner, with the like powers and authority; and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the laws now existing or that may hereafter exist, relative to constables within this commonwealth.

## CHAPTER IV.

*AN ACT*

Dissolving the marriage contract between David Wells and Mary his wife.
