

CHAPTER XLVI.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled, an act to authorise the officers of the land office to accept returns of surveys and direct patents to issue where an excess of more than ten per cent. is returned.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Surveyor General be authorised and required to receive returns of surveys made, or to be made in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, without the issuing of warrants of acceptance for that purpose.

Warrants of acceptance dispensed with.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That nothing in this act, or the act to which this is a supplement, shall prohibit the accepting of surveys or the issuing of patents on titles originating before the fourth day of July one thousand seven hundred, seventy six, and which are protected by the act, entitled "An act for vesting the estates of the late proprietaries of Pennsylvania in this commonwealth," passed the twenty-seventh day of November one thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine.
