Lancaster county, died seized and possessed of a certain lot of ground in said village; having by will, dated the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, directed the distribution of her estate, real and personal; appointed Joseph Vance and John Clark executors of said will, but omitted to authorise said executors to sell and convey said lot.

## Therefore,

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Joseph Vance and John Clark, executors of the last will and testament of Elizabeth Boyes, be, and they are hereby authorised to sell a certain lot of ground situate in Maytown, in Donegal township, Lancaster county, to the highest and best bidder, and convey the same by deed in fee simple, to the purchaser as fully and effectually as Elizabeth Boyes could have done in her lifetime. And the proceeds arising from the sale aforesaid, shall be applied by the said executors, in the manner directed by the last will and testament of Elizabeth Boyes.

# CHAPTER LII.

## A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to incorporate two companies for making an artificial road from the city of Pittsburg, through Butler and Mercer to Meadville."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That for the purpose of making an artificial or turnpike Governor to road, commencing at the north end of the bridge (about to be incorporate built) over the Allegheny river, opposite the city of Pittsburg, two compathrough the borough of Butler to Mercer; it shall and may be nies. lawful for the Governor of this commonwealth, to incorporate two companies on the terms and conditions hereinafter mentioned and provided. One company for making so much of said road as may lie between the city of Pittsburg and the borough of Butler, to be known by the name and style of "The Pittsburg and Butler Turnpike Road Company." And one other company for making so much of said road as may lie between the boroughs of Butler and Mercer, to be known by the name and style of "The Butler and Mercer Turnpike Road Company."

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Henry Baldwin, William Robinson, Robert Camp-Commission-bell and Hugh Davis, of Allegheny county; Dunning McNair, ersappointed John David, William Campbell and John Gilmore, of Butler for one comcounty, are hereby appointed commissioners for the Pitts-pany. burg and Butler turnpike road company; that Jacob Mech Commissionling, John Bredin, David McJunkin and John Brown, of Butler county; and James Millar, Bevan Pearson and John Find-
