

terms of the court of common pleas, in and for the county of Westmoreland, shall continue two weeks when necessary, commencing upon the several days and times now fixed by law; and that the courts of quarter sessions for the said county, may continue during the first week of each of the said terms, and venires shall issue for the summoning and returning of jurors as is directed by law, with respect to all other counties where the term is required to be held or continued for two weeks.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the first day of March next, the courts of general quarter sessions of the peace, and courts of common pleas, in the county of Armstrong, shall commence annually on the third Mondays in March, June, September and December; and in the county of Indiana, on the Mondays following the courts in Armstrong county; and in the county of Cambria, on the Mondays next after the courts in Indiana county.

CHAPTER LXI.

*AN ACT*

To revive and continue in force, certain acts of incorporation therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That “An act to authorise the Governor of this Commonwealth to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over the river Tioga, at the village of Athens or Tioga point,” passed the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, and “An act authorising the Governor to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Tunkhannock, in Luzerne county to Wysox in Bradford county,”

passed the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, be, and the same are hereby revived and continued in force. And the time for opening books for receiving subscription to the stock of the companies to be incorporated by said acts, is hereby extended until the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen. And all proceedings had in pursuance of the aforesaid acts, and of this act, shall have full validity and effect in law.

**SECT. 2.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the time for opening the books for receiving subscriptions to the stock of the Mercersburg and Hancock turnpike road company, be, and the same is hereby extended to the first Monday of June, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen; and all proceedings had in pursuance of this act, shall have full validity and effect in law, any thing contained in the act to the contrary notwithstanding.

## CHAPTER LXII.

### *AN ACT*

To extend to Coppermiths, Brassfounders, Coopers and Venders of sail cloth, certain advantages secured to sundry tradesmen employed in building and fitting ships and vessels for sea.

**SECT. 1.** *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all the provisions contained in the act, passed the twenty-seventh of March, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, entitled “An act to secure the persons employed in the building and fitting ships and vessels for sea, by making the body, tackle, apparel and furniture of such ships and vessels liable to pay the several tradesmen employed in building and fitting them for their work and materials,” and
