CHAPTER LXIII.

AN ACT

To extend the terms of the Supreme Court, for the Lancaster, Middle, Southern and Western Districts.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, the term Western disof the supreme court in and for the western district, shall con-trict. tinue for four weeks; and the judges of the said court in the western district, shall at their first term, after the passage of Duty of the this act, and as often afterwards as occasion may require. Judges. prescribe by rule of court certain days, within the term for the return of writs, from the various judiciary districts, embraced within the said western district of the supreme court; and the causes shall be taken up for argument, according to the order prescribed. And that the term of the southern dis-southern district shall commence on the Monday week, next following trict. the last week of the term of the western district. And that writs of error in the southern district shall be made returnable accordingly.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the first day of October next, the Lancasterdisjudges of the supreme court shall attend and hold one term trict for the Lancaster district, in the city of Lancaster, on the second Monday in May annually; one term for the middle Middle disdistrict in the borough of Sunbury, on the second Monday in trict.

according to the order prescribed.

SECT. 3.
