are authorised and required to settle and adjust the accounts Accounts of of William Clark, for digging a well at the arsenal at Mead-William ville, and for other expenses relative to the said arsenal; the Clark to be amount to be paid by the State Treasurer, on a warrant paid. drawn in the usual manner, not to exceed the sum of eightythree dollars and thirty-seven cents.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid That the superintendant of the arsenal at Meadville, be, Ground aand he is hereby authorised to cause the ground around and round the arin front of the building to be levelled, in such manner as he senalat Meadmay deem necessary, and settle his accounts for the same in villetobe lev-the usual manner, with the accountant department, for which purpose a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars is hereby appropriated.

CHAPTER LXXXVII.

AN ACT

Granting an annuity to Hugh Campbell, a soldier of the revolutionary

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he hereby is directed to pay to Hugh Campbell, of Chester county, or his order, forty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of forty dollars, to be paid half yearly, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.
