such pauper; and if after the death of any such pauper, any slebts or property shall be discovered, which were due or belonging to him or her, the said overseers or directors, shall have power to sue for and collect the same, and to apply the whole or so much thereof as may be necessary to defray the expenses incurred by the support and funeral of said pauper, Balance how and if any balance remain, the same shall be paid over by disposed. said overseers or directors, to the legal heirs or representatives of such pauper, upon demand, and the delivery of a bond to them, with sufficient surety to indemnify such overseers or directors from the claims of all other persons.
