

## CHAPTER CXXXVIII.

## AN ACT

To provide for the repair of Arms, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of two thousand nine hundred fifty eight dollars and seventy one cents, be, and the same is hereby appropriated to pay the expenses incurred at the armory and arsenal at Philadelphia; and that the further sum of one thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to pay such necessary expenses therein as shall be incurred until the first of April eighteen hundred and twenty.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the sum of five hundred dollars be, and is hereby appropriated to pay the necessary expenses in the armory and arsenal at the seat of government, and the like sum of five hundred dollars to defray the necessary expenses of the armory and arsenal at Meadville, until the first April eighteen hundred and twenty.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accounting officers are hereby authorised and required to adjust and settle the accounts of the brigade inspectors for expenses incurred, or which shall be hereafter incurred by them for repairing public arms, furnishing colours, drums, fifes and bugle horns.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Auditor General be, and he is hereby authorised and required to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer for the purposes of this act, on accounts settled in the usual manner.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in case of a deficiency in the funds of any of the regiments of the militia of this commonwealth, the following mentioned militia services shall be payable out of the monies arising from exempt fines under the act of the twenty-fourth of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, entitled "A further supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the regulation of the militia of this commonwealth," viz. For captains services enrolling the militia; taking lists of the exempts and making the returns directed by the third section of the said act; services for the officers sitting on courts of appeal, and for the officer holding militia elections.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That when it shall be certified by a majority of the field officers that the above mentioned services, or either of them cannot be paid out of the regimental funds, the same shall be allowed by the accounting officers in the settlement

of the accounts of the brigade inspectors, payable as aforesaid out of the monies arising from exempt fines on warrants drawn by the Auditor General.

CHAPTER CXXXIX.

*AN ACT*

To provide for the election of Constables in the village of Elizabethtown, in the county of Lancaster, and in the borough of Wilkesbarre in the county of Luzerne.

Two persons to be elected and returned  
One of whom to be appointed.  
SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the electors residing in the village of Elizabethtown, including Wealandsburg, in the county of Lancaster, shall at the usual time appointed by law for the election of constables yearly, and every year after the passage of this act, elect at the house of Michael Coble, in said village, two suitable persons, being citizens thereof, for the office of constable, and shall return the names of the persons so elected, to the next court of general quarter sessions of the peace, to be holden for said county, and the said court shall appoint one of them constable for said village, which constable when so appointed shall have the same powers, and be subject to all the penalties and regulations which constables have and are subjected to under the laws which now or hereafter may exist within this commonwealth.

Two persons to be chosen and returned, and one of them appointed.  
SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors in the borough of Wilkesbarre, in Luzerne county, shall annually at the court house in said borough, on the day appointed by law for the election of constables in the different townships in this commonwealth, elect two reputable citizens of said borough, and return the
