## CHAPTER CLXL

## AN ACT

Relative to the repairing of bridges and the collection of exempt fines in the city and county of Philadelphia.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repreesntatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the Bridges how same, That the several bridges within the county of Philadelkeptinrepair phia, which now are or hereafter may be erected at the expense of said county, shall be kept in repair at the expense And superin. of the same, in the manner hereinafter directed; and shall be and are hereby placed under the superintendance, care and direction of the commissioners of said county, and of the superintendants of the districts of the Northern Liberties and Southwark, and the several supervisors of the highways of the several townships wherein they may be situated. And that it shall be the duty of the said superintendants or supervisors, and they are hereby required to superintend and take care of the several bridges aforesaid, within their townships or districts, and cause to be made all necessary repairs, which shall not exceed in amount the sum of fifty dollars, as often as the same may be required, and after making due proof before any justice of the peace in the said county of the said repairs being made and the costs of the same, to present such proof to the commissioners of said county, whose duty it shall be, and they are hereby required to pay to the superintendant, su-

the said bridge and make report whether any and what repairs are necessary to be done to the same, together with the cost thereof to the said justice, which report shall be filed by the said justice, and a copy thereof delivered to the said superintendant or superintendants, supervisor or supervisors, who shall proceed as soon as the season will admit, to cause the said repairs to be made, provided the repairs so required for any one bridge, do not exceed the sum of one hundred dollars, and on due proof taken before any justice of the county, of the said repairs being done, together with the costs thereof; it shall be the duty of the said superintendant or su-perintendants, supervisor or supervisors, to present such proof such case. to the said commissioners, whose duty it shall be, and they are hereby required to pay the amount of the same to the superintendants, supervisor or supervisors under whose direction the said repairs were done: Provided, The same does Proviso. not exceed the sum of one hundred dollars.

And be it further enacted by the authority afore-County com- said, That in all cases in which fines and forfeited recognimissioners to nances are appropriated to the use of the county of Philadelemploy coun- phia, the commissioners of said city and county are authorisel to collect sed and empowered to employ counsel to prosecute and collect the same, and shall cause to be laid before the auditors, at the settlement of the commissioners accounts for the said county, an account of the sums collected and the cost attending the collection of the same.

SECT. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia To appoint collectors of are hereby authorised if they deem it expedient, to appoint exempt fines, one or more collectors for said county, to collect the militia exempt fines, separate and distinct from the county tax. And

Their power, the said collector or collectors so to be appointed, shall have the same power and authority to collect and enforce the payment of the said exempt fines, in the same manner as the county tax is directed by law to be collected and under the same rules, regulations and restrictions as are provided by the act entitled, "A further supplement to an act for the regulation of the militia of this commonwealth," passed the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, for which the several collectors shall receive and be And compenallowed five per cent on all monies received by them, and
