called Springton, and tract or parcel of land, situate in the township of West Nantmill aforesaid, containing about three hundred and ten acres, and to make and execute a sufficient deed or deeds to the purchaser or purchasers of the same, which shall convey the like interest and have the same force and effect as though the same had been made and executed by the said Henry Crouse in his life time, or by the said minors at full age: Provided, that the said Rudolph Harley and Adam Fisher, or the survivor of them, previous to making a sale in pursuance of this act, shall enter into a recognizance with sufficient security before the orphans' court in and for the county of Chester aforesaid, for the faithful performance of the duties required by this act, and for the proper application of the monies arising from the said sale under the directions of the orphans' court aforesaid.

CHAPTER VII.
