SECT. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Exceptionas said, That the provisions of this act shall not extend to dis-to fine in a charge or relieve any defendant from any fine whatsoever, criminal prosect or imposed in any criminal prosecution.

## CHAPTER XII.

## AN ACT

For the relief of Thomas Smiley.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature, that Thomas Smiley being a good citizen, strongly attached to his country, was on the twenty-fourth day of June, in the year eighteen hundred and one, employed by colonel Abraham Horn, an agent of government, to receive relinquishments from certain settlers on Towanda creek, Luzerne county, and that in consequence of the said appointment, and while in the faithful discharge of his duty, he was attacked by a company of insurgents from other parts of the country, and was by them abused and compelled to leave the country for a considerable length of time, thus sustaining a heavy loss and great abuse on account of his attachment to the government.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Thomas Smiley or to his order, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, immediately after the passing of this act.
