CHAPTER XXXV.

AN ACT

Reducing the number of Directors of the Mechanics' Bank of the city and county of Philadelphia.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That at all elections hereafter to be held for directors of the Mechanic's Bank of the city and county of Philadelphia, as provided by the act, entitled "An act regulating banks," the whole number of directors of the said bank to be elected shall be thirteen, and no more.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the provisions of the act, entitled "An act regulating banks" as are hereby altered, be and the same

is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XXXVI.

AN ACT

For the relief of certain owners of real estate in the district of Southwark, in the county of Philadelphia.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the court of quarter sessions for the county of Court of Philadelphia, on petition for the purpose being made, shall quarter-sesappoint twelve discreet and reputable freeholders, none of sions to apwhom shall own any real estate which will be benefitted by point persons the provisions of this act, who having been first sworn or affirmed, shall inquire what damages the owner or owners of lands, lots, house or houses, or other property shall have sustained, or may sustain by reason of the suspension of the

opening of the streets laid out and recorded by virtue of the act of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, passed for that purpose on the twenty-ninth September, in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, and ten of them agreeing shall make report thereof to the said court.

Secr. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That within three months after the report of the jury hereinbefore directed shall have been made and confirmed by the court of quarter sessions, the damages so assessed and confirmed shall be paid out of the treasury of the county of Philadelphia, to the person or persons whose property may of the treasu- have been injured by the suspension of the opening of the streets aforesaid.

CHAPTER XXXVII.

AN ACT

To vacate part of a state road laid out in pursuance of an act, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a state road from the borough of Marietta, in Lancaster county, to intersect the Middletown and Harrisburgh turnpike road, at or near the house of John Nissly, in Dauphin county.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the road laid out by the commissioners appointed under the act passed the twenty-third of March, eighteen hundred and nineteen, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a state road from the borough of Marietta, in Lancaster county, to intersect the Middletown and Harrisburgh turnpike road, at or near the house of John Nissly, in Dauphin county, as lies within the county of Lancaster, be and the same is hereby vacated,
