CHAPTER XXXVIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to incorporate an academy or public school in the town of Waterford, and for other purposes therein mentioned."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for "the trustees of Trustees to the Waterford academy" to grant, bargain and sell in fee sell 500 acres simple, to the best advantage for the use of the Waterford of land. academy, a certain tract of five hundred acres of land, surveyed and laid off in the reserved tract adjoining the town of Waterford, in the county of Erie, in pursuance of an act of General Assembly, passed the eleventh of April, A. D. one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, entitled "An act to provide for the selling the several reserved tracts of land adjoining the towns of Erie, Franklin, Warren and Waterford, and for other purposes therein mentioned," and on the payment of the purchase money, or on securing the payment thereof, to execute a deed in fee to the purchaser or purchasers with the appurtenances thereunto belonging: Provided. That the said trustees of the Waterford academy shall not be permitted to sell the same for less than ten dollars per acre.

Secr. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said trustees are hereby authorised and directed to vest the proceeds of the sale of the said five hundred Proceeds to acres of land with the appurtenances, in some productive be vested for fund or funds, and the interest thereof to be forever applied the use of by the trustees of said academy, in aid of other revenues to academy. compensate a teacher or teachers in said academy: And that it shall be the duty of the trustees of the Waterford academy. annually under the penalty of forty dollars each, to be

recovered for the use of the county, as debts of the same amount are now by law made recoverable, by any person who shall sue for the same, to lay a statement of the amount of the sale and the manner in which the proceeds thereof shall be vested, before the auditors of the proper county, to be settled, adjusted and published in the same manner as the public accounts of commissioners are by law directed to be settled, adjusted and published: Provided, That the said trustees before making sale of the aforesaid land, shall enter into bond with sufficient sureties before the court of common pleas of said county, conditioned for the faithful performance of the said trust, and for vesting the said proceeds of the sale in some safe and productive fund or funds as aforesaid.

Proviso.

Sect. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the act to which this is a supplement as is hereby altered and supplied, be and the same is hereby re-

pealed.

CHAPTER XXXIX.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to establish a board of wardens for the port of Philadelphia, and for the regulation of pilots and pilotages, and for other purposes therein mentioned."

Ships liable for inward pilotage.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That ships and vessels of all kinds shall, and they are hereby declared to be liable and chargeable for debts due by the owners, masters or consignees thereof, for or on account of inward pilotage; and it shall be lawful for any pilot or pilots to whom any such inward pilotage shall be due and owing, to file a libel against such ship or vessel, her tackle, furniture and apparel, in the district court for the city and county of Philadelphia, or in the court of common pleas of the proper county in which such ship or vessel may be, whereupon process shall
