

CHAPTER XLVIII.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to improve the navigation of the river Delaware, passed the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventeen.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners appointed by virtue of the act to which this a further supplement, to expend the money appropriated thereby, be and they hereby are required to pay the viewers appointed by said act respectively, three dollars ^{§3 per day} per day for every day they have been, or may be employed in the discharge of their respective duties, and the Auditor General is hereby required to settle their accounts accordingly. _{to viewers.}

CHAPTER XLIX.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to afford immediate relief to John Huton, a soldier in the revolutionary war, and to grant him an annuity," passed the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and nine.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, so much of the act to which this is a supplement as authorises the State Treasurer to pay the annuity therein mentioned to Henry Bull, his executors or legal attorney, be and the same is hereby repealed: And the State Treasurer is hereby directed to pay the said annuity to colonel John Ewalt, of Cumberland county, whose duty it shall be to apply the same, and account
