CHAPTER LXII.

À FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act, for laying out, making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways within this Commonwealth, and for laying out private roads."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the several courts of quarter sessions of the peace in the respective counties within this Commonwealth, shall have authority upon application by petition to them made, to enquire of, and to vacate any part of a state road within their State road proper county, which shall be judged to be supplied and ren-may be vadered useless by any substantial and permanent turnpike cated. road, made and completed agreeably to the laws of this Commonwealth, and the said court shall proceed therein by views and reviews thereof in like manner, and the like orders, proceedings and judgment shall be thereupon liad, as are authorised and as is usually practised in vacating any county public road or highway, according to the directions and provisions of the act to which this is a supplement: Provided, That no Proviso. stockholder in any turnpike company within the county where the application is made, shall be a viewer or reviewer.

CHAPTER LXIH.

AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to procure sixty thousand dollars on loan.

SECT. 1. CHAPTER LXIV.

AN ACT

Authorising a partition of the real estate of George Bryan, Esquire, late of the city of Philadelphia, deceased, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature, that George Bryan, esquire, late of the city of Philadelphia, deceased, died possessed of five tracts of unimproved land, situated when surveyed, in the county of Northumberland, now in the counties of Armstrong and McKean, and that in consequence of the derangement in mind of one of the daughters, and the death in a state of insolvency of one of the sons of the said George, a partition of the said land cannot conveniently be made; and, whereas, it has been represented that George Bryan, of the borough of Harrisburg, one of the sons of the said George Bryan, esquire, deceased, has had the sole management and care of his sister, who is thus unhappily diseased for many years, and still continues the care and management of her, and that he has advanced his own monies for her support.
