

CHAPTER LXXX.

AN ACT

Authorising the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia to erect a permanent bridge over the Cohocsink creek, in the township of the Northern Liberties.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia be. and they are hereby authorised to erect a permanent bridge over the Cohocsink creek, in the township of the Northern Liberties, at such site as they shall deem most advantageous to the public, and attended with the smallest expense.

SECT. 2 *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the commissioners to construct the said bridge in such manner as not to contract the width of said creek between the abutments less than forty feet, or the height of the arch less than seven feet above common high-water mark, to the under surface of the crown thereof: *Provided always,* That no such bridge shall be erected unless all the proceedings be respectively had as are prescribed by the twenty-first section of an act, entitled "An act, for laying out, making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways within this Commonwealth, and for laying out private roads," passed the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and two.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of an act, entitled "An act, to declare Cohocsink creek a public highway," passed the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, as is by this act altered or supplied be, and the same is hereby repealed.
