CHAPTER LXXXIV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act, to provide for the erection of a State Penitentiary on the public land adjoining the town of Allegheny, opposite Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny, and for other purposes."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners appointed by the act to which this is a supplement, shall have power, and are hereby autho-Commissionrised, to contract for, acquire and purchase for the use of the ers empow-Penitentiary adjoining the town of Allegheny, in the county ered to pur-of Allegheny, such water and water rights as they may think water rights. necessary and convenient to promote the health and cleanliness of the convicts and others confined within the said Penitentiary, and to lay and keep in repair such pipes and conduits, and to construct all such works as shall be deemed necessary to conduct the said water to, through, and from the said Penitentiary; and for this purpose shall have authority to sink and lay their pipes and conduits across and along any street, lane or public road, in such manner that when the work shall be completed there will be no obstruction to the passage of and travelling upon the same: And the said com-Also right of missioners shall also have power and authority to contract for, laying andreacquire and purchase the right and privilege of laying and re-paring pipes. pairing pipes, and conducting the water aforesaid over and through the lands of any person or persons. where the same may be by them deemed necessary: And if any person or persons shall, after the purchase of the water or water rights as Forfeit of aforesaid, wilfully and maliciously obstruct the passage of the \$20 for injuvater to or from the said Penitentiary, or shall wilfully and ring the maliciously injure or destroy any of the pipes, conduits or pipes, &c.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the whole of the residue of the sum of sixty thousand dollars, mentioned in the act to which this is a supplement, is hereby appropriated and authorised to be drawn from the Treasury, upon the warrants of the Governor of this Commonwealth, and upon the terms provided for in the said act, from time to time as may be required, between the passage of this act and the first day of December next following.
