AN ACT

To extend the time for completing the Milford and Owego turnpike road, and to add additional commissioners to the Northampton and Wilkesbarre turnpike road.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the time for completing the Milford and Owego turnpike road is hereby extended to the first day of Decem-

ber, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Thomas S. Ridgway and Jonathan Fell, of the city of Philadelphia, be, and they are hereby appointed additional commissioners to do and perform the several things mentioned in the act entitled, "An act to authorise the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the borough of Northampton, in the county of Lehigh, to the borough of Wilkesbarre, in the county of Luzerne," passed the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

CHAPTER LXXXVI.

AN ACT

Relative to certain State Roads therein mentioned.

Skor. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to Governor to appoint three commissioners, one of whom shall be a practical appoint 3 surveyor, not residing in either of the counties through which commissionthe road passes, to review the state road laid out in pursuance ers. of the third and fourth sections of the act entitled, "An act

to authorise the Governor to appoint commissioners for the purpose of laying out certain state roads therein mentioned," passed the sixteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and to make such alterations in the route of said road, and vacate such parts thereof as they or a majority of them shall deem necessary for the public good, and shall cause a draft of the alterations of said road, if any, to be made, and the same to be deposited in the Office of the Secretary of this Commonwealth, and shall also deposit a copy of said draft in the office of the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the respective counties through which said road may pass, wherein any alteration may be made as aforesaid, or any part vacated, which shall be a record thereof, and from thenceforth the said road as relaid and altered, shall be to all intents and purposes a public highway, and to be opened and repaired agreeably to the directions of the third section of the act aforesaid.

Commissioners to be sworn. Compensation.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That the commissioners who shall be appointed in pursuance of the first section of this act, shall each of them be sworn in the same manner, and shall receive the same compensation for themselves, chain carriers and markers, and to be paid in the same manner as is prescribed by the fourth

section of the act aforesaid

Sect. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the act, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a state road from Waynesburg, in Greene county, to intersect the Brownsville and Somerset turnpike road at or near Connellsville, in Fayette county," be, and the same is hereby repealed; and the road

laid out under the same, vacated.

Commissioners to vacate and lay out.

Sect. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to appoint three suitable persons, one of whom shall be a practical surveyor, to view, and, if they see cause, vacate the state road leading from the Swan tavern in Downingstown, Chester county, to the Cross Keys in Lancaster county, or any part thereof, and lay out a new road between the above places. making Waggontown and the Compass tavern points in said road: And said commissioners shall proceed to perform the duties required of them by this act, on or before the first Monday of September next, and shall cause a draft of said Copies of the road to be deposited in the Office of the Secretary of this

CHAPTER LXXXVII.
