SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the constable of each respective township, borough or district which shall be bounded by or adjoining to any part of the river Delaware and its branches, shall, previous to obtaining pay for services rendered under the eighth and tenth sections of the act to which this is a supplement, take the following oath or affirmation: I do swear (or affirm) that I have diligently enquired, carefully inspected and viewed, according to law, such parts of the river Delaware or its branches, as were adjoining my township, borough or district, and that I forthwith gave information of every offence committed contrary to the true intent and meaning of the act to which this is a supplement, to a justice of the peace of the county where the offence was committed.

CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

*A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT*

To the act, entitled "An act for laying out, making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways within this Commonwealth, and for laying out private roads."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall and may be lawful for the supervisors of the highways within the several townships in the counties of

Susquehanna, Bradford, Tioga, Potter, McKean, Centre, Clearfield and Lycoming, and they are hereby authorised and empowered, with the assistance of the township assessors respectively, to extend the road tax now allowed by law, to any sum not exceeding one cent in the dollar on the valuation, in any one year, (if the same shall be found necessary in any township) for opening and keeping the public highways in repair: which tax shall be levied, collected and applied by the supervisors in like manner, and subject to all the penalties contained in the act to which this is a further supplement.

CHAPTER LXXXIX.

*AN ACT*

To authorise the Auditor General to settle and adjust the accounts of the Treasurers and Managers of the Susquehanna Lottery.

SECT. 1 *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the Auditor General be, and he is hereby authorised and required, to adjust and settle the accounts of William P. Beatty, treasurer, and the managers of a lottery to raise a sum of money to improve the navigation of the Susquehanna, and certain branches thereof, agreeably to the provisions of the act of the legislature, passed the eighteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and five, and a supplement thereto passed the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and six.

SECT. 2 *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid.* That in case the said treasurer and managers shall neglect or refuse to render their accounts, to the satisfaction of the Auditor General, within six months from and after the passage of this act, the Auditor General is hereby authorised and required to direct the Attorney General, or his deputy, to bring a suit or suits in the name of the Commonwealth,
