

CHAPTER XCIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to raise by way of Lottery a sum of money to enable the trustees of the Protestant Episcopal congregation of the borough of Lancaster, to repair their steeple and house of worship."

Commissioners to complete the drawing.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That one or more of the commissioners appointed by the act to which this is a supplement, be, and they are hereby required, within six months after the passage of this act, to complete and finish the drawing of the said lottery.

If they refuse suits may be brought.

SECT. 2 *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the said commissioners neglect or refuse to perform the duties required of them by the first section of this act, any person or persons who have purchased any ticket or tickets in said lottery, or who have drawn any prize or prizes therein, are hereby authorised to bring suit on the bond which was by the said commissioners executed to the Governor for the faithful performance of their duty, against the said commissioners and their sureties, and against their respective executors or administrators, for the respective amounts due to each of them, and to prosecute the same to judgment and recovery, in the same manner as debts of equal amount are by law recoverable.

CHAPTER XCIV.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, providing for the erection of a State Capitol,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the*

same, That the commissioners appointed by the act, entitled "A supplement to an act providing for the erection of a State Capitol, passed the twenty-seventh day of January, eighteen hundred and nineteen," be, and they are hereby authorised and required to contract with the architect of said capitol, to construct the columns and capitals thereof of hewn stone, and to cover the roof of the dome with some incombustible material: *Provided* the expense of said columns, capitals and dome shall not exceed the sum of fifteen thousand dollars.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said sum of fifteen thousand dollars, be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the purposes aforesaid, which shall be drawn from the treasury on the Governor's warrant, any time after the first day of August next.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the third instalment, made payable by the said act of the twenty-seventh day of January, eighteen hundred and nineteen, shall be reduced from thirty to fifteen thousand dollars, and the fifteen thousand dollars thus directed, shall be added to the second instalment of the aforesaid act, so as to make it forty-five thousand dollars instead of thirty thousand.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the said act of the twenty-seventh of January, eighteen hundred and nineteen, as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XCV.

AN ACT

Altering the times of holding the Courts in the Fifth Judicial District.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the next holding the Courts of the Fifth Judicial District of this Commonwealth, the said Courts shall commence and be held as follow, to wit: In the county of Butler on the first Mondays of January, April, July and
