CHAPTER CXIV.

AN ACT

Providing for the payment of taxes on the lands of Peter Baynton.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Auditor General be, and he is hereby required to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer for the amount of taxes due and that may become due on the lands of Peter Baynton, situate in the counties of Huntingdon, Centre and Venango, until the lien of the state is liquidated, and to redeem any of said lands that may have been sold for taxes, and to refund any taxes which may have been paid by individuals on said lands with the lawful interest, except where such taxes may have been paid by the said Peter Baynton.*
