## CHAPTER CXXIV.

## AN ACT

For the relief of the poor of the townships of Germantown, Bristol, Moyamensing, Blockley and Kingsessing, in the county of Philadelphia, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That so much of the twenty-first section of "An act for the consolidation and amendment of the laws as far as they respect the poor of the city of Philadelphia, the district of Southwark, and the township of the Northern Liberties," Certain laws passed the twenty-ninth of March, one thousand eight extended. hundred and three, as relates to the aldermen and justices of the peace granting orders for the removal of paupers, be, and the same is hereby extended to the townships of Germantown, Bristol, Movamensing, Blockley and Kingsessing, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the first section of "An act laying a tax on dogs in certain counties, and for other purposes," as far as they respect the dog tax of the city of Philadelphia, plied to the the district of Southwark, and the township of the Northern maintenance Liberties, passed the twenty-third day of March, one thou- of the poor. sand eight hundred and nine, as relates to granting the dog tax for the benefit of the poor, be, and the same is hereby extended to the township of Germantown, in the county of Philadelphia: Provided, That the damage sustained by the owners of sheep destroyed by any dog or dogs in the town. Proviso. ships of the Northern Liberties and Germantown, be paid by

the directors of the poor of said townships out of the tax

arising on dogs.

Secr. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of any act or acts of the General Assembly of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania as authorises the guardians of the poor of the city and county of Philadelphia to demand or receive from the commissioners of the said county or the treasurer thereof, any unclaimed jurors or witnesses fees which now are or hereafter may be in the county treasury unclaimed, and subject to their order, be, and the

same is hereby repealed.

Secr. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all unclaimed jurors, witnesses and arbitrators fees, which shall from and after the passage of this act remain unclaimed for one year in the hands of the sheriff of the city and county of Philadelphia, the clerk of the court of quarter sessions and over and terminer, the clerk of the court of common pleas, the clerk of the district court of the city and county of Philadelphia, the clerk of the supreme court for the eastern district, as well as such as may remain unclaimed for one year by any person or persons residing in the county of Philadelphia, but out of the city of Philadelphia, the district of Southwark, and the township of the Northern Liberties, shall belong to the guardians or overseers of the poor of the city or district within which such juror, witness or arbitrator may have resided at the time he became entitled to receive the same.
