CHAPTER XXXIX.

AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to view and lay out a state road from Berrysburg by the way of the town of Gratz, in Dauphin county, to the borough of Reading, in Berks county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to Governor to appoint three disinterested commissioners, one of whom appoint comshall be a practical surveyor, to lay out and mark a state missioners to lay out aroad road, beginning at the west end of the Main street of Ber-from Berrysrysburg, in Mifflin township, Dauphin county, thence to the burg to town of Gratz in said county, thence by the nearest and best Reading. route to the borough of Reading, in the county of Berks, and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall proceed to perform the duties required of them by this act, on or before the first Monday of June next, and shall cause a draft of said road to be deposited in the office of the Secre-Drafts to be tary of the Commonwealth, and shall also deposit a copy of the offices of the said draft in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter the Secretary sessions of the respective counties through which said road of Commonmay pass, which shall be a record thereof; and from thence-wealth and forth the said road shall be to all intents and purposes a pub-clerks of lic highway, and shall be opened and repaired in all respects sions. as other roads are opened and repaired, which are laid out by order of the courts of quarter sessions of this commonwealth.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority afore. said, That each of the said commissioners before he enters Commission. on the duties of said appointment, shall take and subscribe ers to be unbefore a justice of the peace an oath or affirmation, faithfully der oath. and impartially to perform the duties required of him by this act, and shall receive for his services two dollars for each pensation. day he or they shall be necessarily employed in said work, together with a reasonable allowance for chain carriers and markers, and the accounts of said commissioners shall be To be paid markers, and the accounts of said commissioners shall be to be paid to adjusted and settled by the commissioners of the respective through counties through which said road shall pass, and paid by war-which the rants drawn on the treasurer, by the commissioners of the road passes. respective counties aforesaid, according to the distance said 3,0ad shall pass through each county.
