CHAPTER LXXIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to alter the judiciary system of this commonwealth," passed February twenty-fourth, eighteen hundred and six.

SECK. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passage of this act, the courts of quarter sessions in the counties of Chester, Montgomery and Schuylkill, may and they are hereby authorised to continue one week at each session of said courts; and so much of the sixteenth section of the act to which this is a supplement as is hereby altered, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
