

CHAPTER LXXX.

AN ACT

To prevent fishing with nets, &c. in East Conococheague creek, Franklin county.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That any person or persons who shall draw any seine, or make use of any dip net, set net, gill net, stirring, or any other kind of nets, or shall erect or cause to be erected any fish dam or basket in East Conococheague creek, extending two miles south and east from the borough of Chambersburg, shall pay a fine of five dollars for every such offence, to be recovered as debts of equal amount are by law recoverable, on being legally convicted thereof on the testimony of one or more credible witnesses, before any justice of the peace of said county, one moiety thereof to be paid to the informer, and the other moiety to the supervisors of roads of the township wherein the conviction shall have taken place, to be applied towards the improvement of the highways.

CHAPTER LXXXI.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to incorporate the town of Columbia, in the county of Lancaster."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the chief burgess of the borough of Columbia,

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of any former law as is hereby altered or supplied, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER LXXXII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to view the ground from the west end of the Harrisburg bridge to the river Juniatta at or near Millerstown."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, to make two copies duly certified, of so much of the draft accompanying the report of commissioners made in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, as extends from the west end of the Harrisburg bridge, in the county of Cumberland, to the town of Petersburg, in the county of Perry, and transmit the same to the clerks of the courts of quarter sessions of the peace of the said counties respectively.
