

CHAPTER LXXXIV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to promote the comfort of the poor."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of October next, one stove in the possession of any debtor, shall be and hereby is exempted from levy or sale on any execution or distress for rent, or other legal process which may be issued against such debtor, for debts or rent contracted after said first day of October.

CHAPTER LXXXV.

AN ACT

For the relief of John Huey, of Berks county.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the accounting officers of this commonwealth be, and they are hereby directed to liquidate and settle agreeably to the provisions of the tenth section of the act, entitled "An act making certain appropriations, and to enable the Governor of this commonwealth to negotiate certain loans, and for other purposes therein mentioned," passed the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and three, the value of a new loan certificate number sixteen thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, issued to Francis Holland, or bearer, for the sum of four pounds thirteen shillings and nine pence, and the sum so found due thereon shall be paid to John Huey,
