## CHAPTER LXXXVII.

## A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to provide for the better preservation and increase of the library of this commonwealth."

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum annually appropriated by the act to Money annuwhich this is a supplement, for the purpose of defraying the ally approexpenses incident to the state library, and for purchasing printed how additional books and maps, shall be paid in the usual manner paid. on warrants to be drawn by the chairman of the joint library committee for the time being, and countersigned by the speaker of the House of Representatives; and if in any year the sum expended shall be less than six hundred dollars, the amount thus deficient may be drawn for in any subsequent year, and it shall be the duty of the said committee, at least ten days previous to the adjournment of each succeeding session of the legislature, to make a report to both houses of of their disbursements.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the library committee shall be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to select such books and print-Certain ed documents of a public nature, which have been transmit-books to be ted or may hereafter be transmitted from the department placed in the of state at Washington, and also such laws of the several state library. States in the union which have been sent or may hereafter be sent by the proper authorities to the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and which may not properly belong to that office, for the purpose of placing such books and printed documents and laws so selected in the state library

for the use of the legislature.
