

CHAPTER XCVIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act directing the formation of a map of Pennsylvania."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he hereby is authorised and required to pay such a sum or sums in addition to what has been already paid to John Melish, as will amount to six hundred dollars for each of the counties of Philadelphia, Delaware, Montgomery and Chester, which shall be in full for collecting materials and constructing the maps of said counties, four hundred dollars of which shall be paid to James Hindman, of Chester county, and the remainder shall be paid to the engraver or engravers of the state map, on orders drawn by the Secretary of the Commonwealth and Surveyor General.

Money to be paid in addition to what has been paid to John Melish.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Secretary of the Commonwealth and Surveyor General, be, and they hereby are authorised as soon as they deem it expedient, to draw their warrant or warrants on the State Treasurer in favor of the engraver or engravers of the state map, for fifteen hundred dollars, the sum which is allowed the publisher for superintending the work, by the fifth section of the act to which this is a supplement, passed the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen: *Provided,* That before the engraver or engravers shall receive any of the money to be advanced by the provisions of this act, he or they shall enter into bond with security to the satisfaction of the Secretary of the Commonwealth and Surveyor General, for the speedy completion of the work.

\$1,500 in favor of the engraver of the state map, &c

Proviso.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the publisher of the state map shall receive a credit on the settlement of his account, for the amount of money to be advanced to the engraver or engravers by the provisions of this act: *Provided,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect the contract which has been entered into between the Secretary of the Commonwealth and Surveyor General, and the publisher of the state map.
