Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. SECT. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said court shall upon the return of the cita Court to aption, or at such other time to which they shall adjourn the point as-matter, appoint assignees on helalf of the creditors of the matter, appoint assignees on behalf of the creditors of the said company, to whom all the goods and chattels, rights and credits, books, vouchers and evidences of debt belonging to

the said corporation shall be assigned.

Secr. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said assignees shall account to, and settle with Assignees to the creditors of the said corporation, in the same manner and account, &c. under the same regulations that the assignces of insolvent debtors are required by law to account to, and settle with the creditors of such insolvents.

CHAPTER CII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to enable the Governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Erie to Waterford."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General
