

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said court upon due proof made to them that the said citation has been served upon the said managers, or a majority of them, shall proceed to hear and examine the matter, and if it should appear that the said managers have not fully accounted to the creditors of said company to the extent of the rights, credits, goods and chattels of the said corporation, or if the said managers refuse to appear, or neglect or refuse to exhibit to the said court a full and satisfactory account of all books and vouchers, and of all debts due the said company, then and in such case the said court shall issue their attachment against such managers upon whom the citation was served, and cause the same to be enforced and executed, until the said managers shall deliver up all books, vouchers or evidences of debt belonging to the said company.

The court to hear and examine, and on refusal or neglect to compel a delivery of books, &c.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said court shall upon the return of the citation, or at such other time to which they shall adjourn the matter, appoint assignees on behalf of the creditors of the said company, to whom all the goods and chattels, rights and credits, books, vouchers and evidences of debt belonging to the said corporation shall be assigned.

Court to appoint assignees.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said assignees shall account to, and settle with the creditors of the said corporation, in the same manner and under the same regulations that the assignees of insolvent debtors are required by law to account to, and settle with the creditors of such insolvents.

CHAPTER CII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to enable the Governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Erie to Waterford."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General*

Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That the Governor of this commonwealth is hereby authorised by license under his hand and the lesser seal of the commonwealth, to permit the president, managers and company to erect and fix such gates or turnpikes upon and across the said road, as will be necessary and sufficient to collect the tolls and duties granted to the said company, by virtue of and in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement.

Governor authorised to issue a license to erect gates.

Company to report to the Auditor General annually.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said company shall at the end of each and every year hereafter, lay before the Auditor General an abstract of their accounts, shewing the whole amount of capital expended in making said road, and of the income and profits arising from the tolls received thereon, during the said year, with an exact account of the costs and charges of keeping the said road in repair, and all other contingent costs and charges, in order that the clear annual income and profits thereof may be made known and ascertained, on which the tolls shall be regulated as directed at decennial periods in the act to which this is a supplement, any thing in that act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER CIII.

AN ACT

To encourage domestic industry, and promote the comfort of the poor.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of September next, every debtor shall be, and is hereby allowed to hold any number of sheep not exceeding six, exempt from levy or sale on execution or other legal process, for any debt except for rent: *Provided,* That the aforesaid exemption, shall extend only to

Property exempt from levy and sale.
