Governor authorised to issue a license to erect gates.

Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That the Governor of this commonwealth is hereby authorised by license under his hand and the lesser seal of the commonwealth, to permit the president, managers and company to erect and fix such gates or turnpikes upon and across the said road, as will be necessary and sufficient to collect the tolls and duties granted to the said company, by virtue of and in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said company shall at the end of each and

report to the stract of their accounts, shewing the whole amount of capital
Auditor Gen. expended in making said road, and of the income and profits
eral annually. arising from the tolls received thereon, during the said year,
with an exact account of the costs and charges of keeping
the said road in repair, and all other contingent costs and
charges, in order that the clear annual income and profits
thereof may be made known and ascertained, on which the
tolls shall be regulated as directed at decennial periods in
the act to which this is a supplement, any thing in that act
contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER CIII.

AN ACT

To encourage domestic industry, and promote the comfort of the poor.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of September next, Property ex. every debtor shall be, and is hereby allowed to hold any numemptirom ber of sheep not exceeding six, exempt from levy or sale on levy and sale execution or other legal process, for any debt except for rent: Provided, That the aforesaid exemption, shall extend only to

cases where the debt shall have been contracted after the said first day of September next.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That upon the decease of any poor inhabitant of this the widow shall be allowed to retain for the to retain ceresupport and comfort of herself and family, all goods and tain property chattles that would have been exempted from execution during the life of such decedent.

CHAPTER CIV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to regulate the fisheries in the river Delaware and its branches, and for other purposes," passed the twenty-third February, one thousand eight hundred and nine, and for other purposes.

SEOT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the seventh section of the act to which this is a supplement, as relates to the compensation to Compensaconstables, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu tion to consthereof each of the constables for performing the duties as stables required by the aforesaid act, shall receive as a full compensation one half of the forfeitures recovered, on information by him given, and the remainder to go to the supervisors as heretofore.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the passage of this act, the third Repeal. and fourth sections of an act, entitled "A supplement to the
