

within the county of Chester, and which sheep shall belong to, and be owned by, any person or persons residing out of the said county, and not within any county or district in which a tax is levied and collected on dogs, such person or persons shall not be entitled to receive from the commissioners of the said county of Chester any compensation for the sheep so destroyed.

Of sheep destroyed, owned by non-residents.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the commissioners of the said county of Chester annually, at the same time that the accounts of the county are published, to publish an account of the receipts and expenditures under this act and the act to which it is a supplement, particularly stating the amount of tax received from each township, and the sums paid to each individual for sheep destroyed within the township in which he resides.

Commissioners to publish an account of receipts and expenditures &c.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the act passed March twenty-fifth, eighteen hundred and fourteen, entitled, "A supplement to an act laying a tax on dogs in certain counties, and for other purposes," as relates to the county of Chester, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER CXI.

AN ACT

Appointing commissioners to open and construct a road in Lycoming county, from Carpenter's mill, in Loyalsock towaship, to Hogland's mill, in Elkland township.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all sums of money which may hereafter be received by the treasurer of the county of Lycoming, for, or on ac-

count of, the road taxes assessed and levied upon unseated lands within the townships of Loyalsock and Elkland, in the said county, for and during the term of four years, from and after the passing of this act, are hereby appropriated and shall be held on a distinct and separate account, by the treasurer of the said county for the time being, subject to the orders of the commissioners hereinafter named.

To be applied to opening and constructing a road from Carpenter's mill, &c.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That John Turk, Esquire, and William Watson, of the county of Lycoming, be, and they hereby are constituted and appointed commissioners under this act, whose duty it shall be, as soon as they have ascertained that there is a sum in the hands of the treasurer sufficient to authorise them to commence the making of said road, to contract with a proper person or persons to open, clear and construct, in such a manner as will admit of the free and convenient passage of travellers and carriages, a certain road which has been viewed under the direction of the court of quarter sessions and duly confirmed by the said court, leading from, or near, Carpenter's mill, in Loyalsock township, to Hogland's mill, in Elkland township, in the said county. And the said commissioners, whenever any portion of the said road shall be finished to their satisfaction and according to the terms of the contracts they may enter into by virtue of this act, or from time to time as they may deem proper for the purpose of completing the said road, or any part or portion thereof, shall draw their order or orders upon the treasurer of the said county of Lycoming, who is hereby directed and required to pay the amount of the same. *Provided,* That the monies so paid by the treasurer, as aforesaid, shall not exceed the whole amount of the road tax received by him for unseated lands in the aforesaid townships.

Commissioners to give bond with securities.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said commissioners named in the second section of this act shall give a bond or bonds, with proper securities, to be approved of by the court of quarter sessions of the county of Lycoming, in the sum of one thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties enjoined upon them by this act; which bond or bonds shall be placed on record in the office for recording deeds, &c in the said county, and deposited in the office of the clerk of the said court of quarter sessions; and the said commissioners shall account to the said court of quarter sessions in each and every year, at the first sessions thereof, for the due application of so much of the said road tax as they may have received. And the said commissioners shall receive out of the said road tax the sum of one dollar and fifty cents per diem, for every day necessarily employed in the duties aforesaid, as a full compensation therefor. And in case of the death or inability of either of the said commissioners, the court of quarter sessions shall, upon application to them made, appoint a suitable

CHAPTER CXII.

AN ACT

Authorising Ebenezer Rambo, executor of the last will and testament of Mathew Knox, late of Montgomery county, deceased, to sell and convey real estate.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That Ebenezer Rambo, executor of the last will and testament of Mathew Knox, deceased, be, and he is hereby authorised to sell and convey to the highest bidder, either by public or private sale, certain real estate whereof the said Mathew Knox, deceased, died seized, situate in the counties of Mercer and Crawford, in this Commonwealth. *Provided,* That the said Ebenezer Rambo shall first enter into a recognizance in the Orphans' court of Montgomery county, with sufficient sureties, to the satisfaction of the said court, conditioned for the faithful exercise of this power, and that the proceeds of the sales hereby authorised shall be applied to the payment of the debts of the deceased, agreeably to law, and the balance, if any, be disposed of according to the last will and testament of the said Mathew Knox, deceased. *And provided also,* That nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to affect the rights of any other individual or individuals.
