CHAPTER CXVI.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to authorise the Governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for erecting a permanent bridge over the river Schuylkill, at or near the city of Philadelphia."

SECT. 1. Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That any constable or constables of the city and coun. CHAPTER CXVII.

A SUPPLEMENT
