CHAPTER CXVII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled, "An act to authorise the Auditor General to settle and adjust the accounts of the treasurer and managers of the Susquehanna Lottery"

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners named in or appointed by virtue of an act of the legislature, passed the eighteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and five, entitled "An act to raise by way of lottery the sum of twenty thousand dollars to improve the river Susquehanna and its branches," or any other person or persons that may have been appointed agreeably to the provisions of the act aforesaid, who are authorised to draw certain sums of money, and were required to apply the same to remove obstructions and improve the navigation of the river Susquehanna and its branches, and who have not heretofore settled their accounts with the managers of said lottery, are hereby required on or before the first day of November next, to exhibit a statement of their accounts, designating the obstructions removed, and the improvements made, and by whom, and on what part of the river aforesaid to the Auditor General, who is hereby authorised and required to settle and adjust the same; and if it shall appear on the settlement of their accounts, that the whole or any part of the amount so drawn by the said commissioners has not been lawfully expended, the said commissioners respectively, are hereby required and directed to pay into the state treas-

surey such balance appearing against them, with interest there-
 on, commencing one year after the money was received, and that the treasurer and managers of the Susquehanna lottery are hereby required and directed, to transmit to the Auditor General all the books, bonds and papers in their possession, that in anywise have relation to the said commissioners.

Balance to be paid with interest, &c.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the said commissioners or other persons shall neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of this act, the Auditor General is hereby authorised, if in his opinion it shall be necessary, to direct the Attorney General, his deputy or deputies, to bring suits against such delinquent commissioners or other persons, for the recovery of the money so as aforesaid received and not lawfully expended by them, and prosecute the same to a final judgment, and if upon the trial of any such suits, it shall appear that the said commissioners or other persons have lawfully expended the whole of the money which came into their hands, judgment shall be rendered against them for costs of suit only.

Attorney General to prosecute delinquent commissioners or others.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That immediately after the passing of this act, the balance that remains in the hands of William P. Beatty, treasurer, shall be paid by him into the State Treasury, and also the sums in notes or obligations taken by the managers, as well as any sums that may be found due from the commissioners or other persons, when recovered shall be paid into the State Treasury, to be appropriated to improve the navigation of the Susquehanna and its branches, as the legislature may hereafter direct.

The treasurer to pay over the balance in his hands.
