CHAPTER CXVIII.

AN ACT

To legalize the public accounts settled by the auditors of the counties of M'Kean and Potter, and for other purposes.

Certain accounts settled by the auditors declared valid.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the public accounts of the commissioners and treasurers of the counties of M'Kean and Potter, as settled and adjusted by the auditors of the said counties for the years eighteen hundred and seventeen, eighteen hundred and eighteen hundred and nineteen, be, and the same are hereby declared valid, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

When auditors shall be elected in MKean and Potter counties.

Secr. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the electors of the county of M'Kean, shall on the second Tuesday of October next, elect two persons as auditors for the said counties, the highest in vote to serve three years, and the next highest for the term of one year: and the electors of the county of Potter, shall in like manner at the said election elect one person to serve as an auditor for the said counties, for the term of two years, and a succession of the said auditors shall hereafter be kept up by an election of one person every other year, by the electors of Potter county, and one person every other year by the electors of M'Kean, which auditors when duly elected and qualified, shall have and enjoy all and singular such authorities as auditors for any other county have by law, and so much of the act provisionally organizing the counties of M'Kean and Potter, as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
