

CHAPTER CXXXII.

AN ACT

Making appropriations to defray certain expenses of government therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That for the payment of the expenses hereinafter mentioned, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to wit:

Clerk hire in the office of the Secretary of the commonwealth.

For clerk hire in the office of Secretary of the Commonwealth, for one year, two thousand dollars.

Auditor General.

For clerk hire in the office of the Auditor General, five hundred dollars in addition to the permanent appropriation of one thousand dollars, and the further sum of sixty-four dollars for extra clerk hire for George R. Horter, for the last year.

State Treasurer.

For clerk hire in the office of the State Treasurer, three hundred dollars in addition to the permanent appropriation already authorised by law.

Secretary of the Land Office.

For clerk hire in the office of the Secretary of the Land Office, for one year, commencing on the first day of April next, the sum of one thousand seven hundred dollars, in addition to the permanent appropriation already authorised.

Surveyor General.

For clerk hire in the office of the Surveyor General, for one year commencing on the first day of April next, the sum of five hundred and fifty dollars in addition to the permanent appropriation already authorised; and the clerk hire aforesaid shall be paid quarterly in the usual manner.

Contingent expenses. Sec'y commonwealth. Land department. Auditor General.

For contingent expenses in the office of the Secretary of the commonwealth, for one year, two thousand dollars. In the office of the Secretary of the Land Office, for one year, seven hundred and fifty dollars. In the office of the Surveyor General, for one year, including the expenses of the Board of Property, four hundred and fifty dollars. In the Auditor General's Office, one hundred and fifty dollars in addition to the permanent appropriation already authorised. And the sums hereby appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any monies in the treasury, previous to which the officers holding the aforesaid offices shall exhibit their accounts and vouchers for said expenditures to the accountant department, to be adjusted and settled.

How paid.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised to pay to George Dennison of Luzerne county, the sum of one hundred and sixty dollars, out of any monies in the trea-

sury not otherwise appropriated, for services rendered as counsel for the commonwealth.

CHAPTER CXXXIII.

AN ACT

To authorise the president and managers of the Coshecton bridge company, to erect a toll house and gate, at or near the west end of said bridge, in the township of Damascus in Wayne county.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the president and managers of the Coshecton bridge company, are hereby authorised to erect a suitable toll house and gate, at or near the west end of the Coshecton bridge, erected across the river Delaware, in Damascus township, in the county of Wayne, and to receive such tolls for the passing of said bridge, as the said company are or may be entitled to receive by any law or laws of the state of New York: *Provided,* That before the said company shall proceed to erect said toll house and gate, the consent of the owner or owners of the land whereon the same shall be erected, shall first be obtained: *And provided also,* That the same shall not obstruct any public road or highway laid out under the laws of this commonwealth.
