

CHAPTER CXXXIV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to incorporate the Berwick Water company."

When the company shall elect 5 managers.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the stockholders to the Berwick water company, shall hereafter on the third Tuesday of December in each and every year, elect by ballot five managers to conduct and manage the business of the said company, and at such annual election each stockholder who shall not own more than fifteen shares, shall be entitled to one vote for each share.

Repeal.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the act to which this is a supplement as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER CXXXV.

AN ACT

To compensate John Davis for certain rations furnished by him to a detachment of troops in the service of this state, during the late war.

The Auditor General to settle the account of J. Davis.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Auditor General is hereby authorised and required to adjust and settle the account of John Davis, of Allegheny county, for fourteen hundred and forty-eight rations, delivered to a detachment of troops at Meadville, called by an express from major general Mead into the service of this commonwealth, during the late war.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid.* That the Auditor General shall allow twenty-five cents for each ration thus furnished, and after having deducted from the whole amount the sum of two hundred and seven-^{Allowance for each ration.}teen dollars twenty cents, which has been paid by the United States, the Auditor General shall draw his warrant upon the State Treasurer in favor of the said John Davis for the balance.

CHAPTER CXXXVI.

AN ACT

To authorise the trustees of Leonard Walter, to borrow money on mortgage.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Casper Snyder and John Army, trustees appointed by the court of common pleas of Chester county, of Leonard Walter, an habitual drunkard, be, and they are hereby authorised to borrow such sum or sums of money as may be necessary to pay the debts of the said Leonard Walter, and to mortgage his real estate for the security and payment of the same: *Provided however,* That the said trustees shall first exhibit a statement of the said debts to the court of common pleas of said county, and give such security as the said court may require for the faithful disposition of the money so to be borrowed.
