CHAPTER CXXXVII.

AN ACT

Authorising the Downingstown, Ephrata and Harrisburg Tumpike Road company, to extend the road to the Harrisburg bridge.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Downingstown, Ephrata and Harrisburg turnpike road company, be, and they are hereby authorised to extend said road to and along Market street through the borough of Harrisburg, to the bridge over the Susquehanna river, under the same regulations, and subject to the same restrictions that are provided for in the original act of incorporation: Provided, That no gate shall be erected on that part of the said road hereby extended.

CHAPTER CXXXVIII.

AN ACT

For the removal of certain actions of ejectment for lands in Schuylkill county, which were instituted in Berks county, before the division thereof.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all actions of ejectment for lands and premises lying in the county of Schuylkill, which were instituted before the county was divided from the county of Berks, and in which final judgment is not entered, be, and they are removed to the court of common pleas of said county of Schuylkill, which said actions of ejectment shall be pending and tried in the court of common pleas of said county of

Echuylkill, and be liable to the same rules and regulations as if they had been commenced therein; and the prothonotary of the court of common pleas of the county of Berks, on or before the first day of May next, shall transcribe the docket entries of the said actions of ejectment so depending as aforesaid, and deliver the same and the records, documents and papers appertaining thereto, to the prothonotary of the court of common pleas of the county of Schuylkill, for which service he shall receive twenty-five cents for each docket entry transcribed, to be paid and taxed as costs of suit in such actions.

CHAPTER CXXXIX.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, cutitled "An act to compel assignees to settle their accounts, and for other purposes."
