Authorising a review of parts of a state road in Fayette and Greene counties.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Robert Boyd, John Bute and Freeman Lewis, or Commission- any two of them, be, and they are hereby authorised and directed to meet at Middletown, in the county of Fayette, on or before the first Monday of June and proceed to review that part of the state road laid out from the White Horse, in Somerset county, to the Virginia line in the direction of Grave creek, which lies between the top of the hill east of Middletown and the national road at or near George Oldshoe's tavern; and if they or any two of them shall be of opinion that as good ground, the inclination or depression of which shall not exceed five degrees, can be selected without materially increasing the distance and so as to lessen the damage to those through whose property it may pass, they or a majority of them shall proceed to survey the same, and shall vey & cause cause a draft with the courses and distances marked thereon a draft of the to be deposited in the office of the Secretary of the Commonmade and de- wealth, and shall also deposit a copy thereof with the clerk posited, &c. of the court of quarter sessions of the county of Fayette, which shall be a record of said road; and said road from thenceforward shall to all intents and purposes be a public

CHAPTER CLI.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled, "An act to raise and collect county rates and levies.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That whenever it shall happen that any collector of county taxes has failed or hereafter shall fail to collect the amount of tax contained in his duplicate within the time now prescribed by law, it shall and may be lawful for the said collector, in his own name, to sue for and recover the amount of taxes due from any person or persons in the same manner that debts of equal amount are or may be by law recoverable, notwithstanding the time fixed for such collection has expired.
