CHAPTER CLIII.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act for the consolidation and amendment of the laws as far as they respect the poor of the city of Philadelphia, the district of Southwark, and the township of the Northern Liberties, and for other purposes."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of May next, it shall not be lawful for any guardian of the poor of the city of Philadelphia, the district of Southwark, and township of the Northern Liberties, to be directly or indirectly concerned in any contract for the supply or delivery of any article of goods, wares, merchandize, food, or other thing intended to be used or consumed in the alms-house, house of employment, or children's asylum; and if any such guardian shall be convicted before any alderman or justice of the peace, of having been directly or indirectly concerned or engaged in any such contract, he shall pay a fine of one hundred dollars for the use of the poor of the city of Philadelphia, the district of Southwark, and township of the Northern Liberties, to be recovered as penalties are now recovered for offences under the jurisdiction of justices of the peace.
