Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Auditor General be, and he is hereby authorised and required to settle and adjust the account of Lazarus

president of the United States, for the year one thousand
eight hundred and sixteen, from Pittsburg to Harrisburg, in

law; and when the said account shall be so adjusted, the Auditor General shall draw his warrant on the State Treasurer

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Auditor General be, and he is hereby authorised and required to settle and adjust the account of John Arent, Esq. sheriff of Adams county, for transmitting to Harrisburg the return of the late election for electors of president and vice president of the United States, in the same manner and for the same amount as if the said return had arrived at Harrisburg within the time prescribed by law; and when said account shall be so adjusted, the Auditor General shall draw his warrant on the State Treasurer for the same.

## CHAPTER CLIX.

## AN ACT

Anthorising the court of quarter sessions of Lehigh county, to direct a review of a part of the state road leading from the borough of North ampton to Jonestown.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repres sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the court of quarter sessions of Lehigh county, be, and they are hereby authorised to appoint six disinterested freeholders to view that part of the state road laid out from the borough of Northampton, to where it intersects the old road laid out by commissioners appointed by an act of as-sembly passed March sixteenth, A. D. eighteen hundred and nineteen, and if upon the report of the said viewers, or any five of them, making any alteration in the route of said road, the court should approve and confirm the same, a draft of the courses and distances of such alteration shall be filed in the office of the clerk of the said county, and a duplicate thereof transmitted to the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and the said road so laid out shall thereafter be part of the state road aforesaid, and that part rendered unnecessary thereby shall be vacated, and the expense of the viewers shall be paid by
