AN ACT

To authorize the Orphans' Court of Dauphin county to appoint William Ayres, of Dauphin county, trustee of Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Ayres; and her children.

The Orphans' Court of Dauphin co. authorized on application to appoint Wm. Ayres trustee of Mary E. Ayres and her children, with power to vest moneys, &c.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Orphans' Court of Dauphin county, upon application, are hereby authorized to appoint William Ayres trustee of Mary Elizabeth Ayres, and her children, with full powers to vest the moneys of the said Mary Elizabeth in such property as he may think most advantageous for the benefit of his wife and children, in room of Conrad Bucher, who has declined to act.

SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in all cases, when the said trustee may have vested any of the aforesaid funds in the purchase of stock or real estate, and at any time thereafter he shall think it expedient, or more advantageous for the benefit of his wife and children, to change the same; he shall have full power to assign, transfer and convey, the whole or any part thereof, and to invest, with the approbation of the Orphans' Court of Dauphin county, the proceeds of the same in the purchase of any other property, as the trustee as aforesaid.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the "Act to enable the Governor to appoint Notaries Public, and for other purposes."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized to

appoint four additional notaries public in the county of Allegheny, one of whom shall reside in the borough of Allegheny, and one in the borough of the Northern Liberties, who shall hold their offices only during the continuance of their residence in the said boroughs respectively, under the restrictions and provisions contained in the act to which this is a supplement, excepting, only, so much of the first proviso in the second section of said act, which limits the number of notaries public in the county of Allegheny, which part of said proviso, and no more, is hereby repealed.

The Gov. authorized to appoint four additional notaries public for Allegheny co. Where to reside. Part of original act repealed.

SECTION 2. That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized to appoint one additional notary public in the county of Bucks, who shall reside at Doylestown, in said county, and who shall hold his office only during the continuance of his residence in said town, under the restrictions and provisions contained in the act to which this is a supplement.

The Gov. to appoint an additional notary for the co. of Bucks. To reside in Doylestown.

AN ACT

For the relief of George Hood, John Spering, John Ulrich, and Valentine Stober, soldiers, and Margaret Loeb, the widow of a revolutionary soldier.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to George Hood, of the city of Philadelphia, to John Spering, of the county of Philadelphia, to John Ulrich, of Berks county, and to Valentine Stober, of Centre county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars to each, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION 2. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Margaret Loeb, of Lebanon county, the
