AN ACT

To make records and exemplifications of records evidence.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That whenever provision has been or shall hereafter be made by law for recording in the proper office any paper or papers, the record and records thereof made, and exemplifications of the same lawfully certified, shall be legal evidence in all cases in which the same would be competent testimony.

AN ACT

For the improvement and increase of the State library.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Secretary of the Commonwealth be, and he is hereby authorized and required to procure for the State library, by purchase, or exchange of duplicates and of copies of Pennsylvania digests, statutes at large, or law reports, as he may deem most expedient, copies of the statutes at large, digests and law reports of the United States, and of the several States and Territories thereof, not already placed in the said library; and he is further authorized and required, in like manner to purchase or exchange, from time to time, as soon as may conveniently be after their publication, any additional volumes of said digests, statutes at large, and law reports, as may be published: *Provided*, That the expense thereof be paid out of the contingent fund of the state department.

Sec'y of the Commonwealth to procure for the S. library digests of the laws, statutes at large, and reports of adjudged cases of the U. S. and of the several states.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Commonwealth be, and he is hereby authorized and required to procure for the State

library, copies of all the Pennsylvania law reports not already placed in the said library; and he is further authorized and required, from time to time, to purchase, as soon as conveniently may be after their publication, such new works or additional volumes of said reports as may be published: *Provided*, That the expense thereof be paid out of the contingent fund of the State department.

SECTION 3. In addition to the appropriations heretofore made for the support and increase of the library, there be appropriated the further sum of four hundred dollars per annum.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the several acts relating to the District Court of the counties of Lancaster and York, and to the Court of Quarter Sessions of York county,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That all suits, issues, rules, and motions in any cause now depending, or which may hereafter be depending in the District Court of York county, in which the judge of said court may have been interested as counsel, shall be tried and determined by the judge of the District Court of the county of Lancaster, whose duty it shall be to attend at every District Court of the county of York, in which any such causes shall be for trial or argument: *Provided*, The prothonotary of said District Court of York county shall transmit to him a list of all such cases, twenty days before the time of holding said court.

Judge of the Dist. Court of Lancaster to try certain cases.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. The jurisdiction of the District Court of York county shall extend to trial of all issues which now have been ordered, or hereafter may be ordered, by the Court of Common Pleas, or Orphans' Court; and said issues may be removed into the said District Court, and there tried in the same manner as issues from the Register's Court now are removed and tried.

Jurisdiction of the Dist. Court of York co. to extend to all issues in the C. P. and O. C.

SECTION 3. From and after the passage of this act, the judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the peace for the county of York, are hereby authorized and empowered to con-
