

**Proviso.**

the United States of America, by indenture dated the twenty-second day of June, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, duly executed and acknowledged and recorded in the office for recording deeds in the said county of Philadelphia, in deed book G W R nine, page six hundred and six, together with the Naval Asylum for sick and disabled seamen thereon erected and all the buildings and appurtenances thereunto belonging, are hereby ceded and conveyed to the United States of America : *Provided always nevertheless*, That nothing herein contained shall prevent the laying out and opening of a certain street not exceeding seventy feet in width, called Sutherland avenue, through the westerly part of the said premises above high water mark, as the same is laid down and designated in the report made to the court of Quarter Sessions of the said county, on the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, as the same is laid down by the commissioners appointed under an act of Assembly, entitled, "an act authorising the laying out of streets and roads in the township of Passyunk, in the county of Philadelphia," passed on the twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two : *Provided always nevertheless*, That the cession hereby made shall continue in force so long as the same territory shall be used by the government of the United States for the purposes of a United States Naval Asylum for sick and disabled seamen : *And provided also*, That all process, civil and criminal, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, shall extend into and be effected within the territory hereby ceded as if this law had not been passed.

### AN ACT

Further to extend the provisions of "An act, relative to the patenting of lands," passed the eighth day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That all the provisions of the act, entitled "An act, rela-

tive to the patenting of lands," passed the eighth day of April, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine; and also of the act, to extend the provisions of the foregoing act, passed the twenty-first day of March, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and thirty-one be, and the same are hereby extended, and shall continue in full force and operation for the term of one year, from and after the eighth day of April, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and thirty-four.

AN ACT

To Incorporate the Harmony Bridge Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the capital stock of the Harmony bridge company shall amount to five thousand dollars, and that the same shall be divided into shares of fifty dollars each; and the subscribers to the said capital stock, shall pay the sum or sums of money for the share or shares by them, respectively, subscribed at such periods, and in such proportions as the directors of the said company may determine. Capital \$5000

SECTION 2. That Charles Hatch, Levi Westfall, John Com-  
fort, Nathan S. Williams, and Jesse Lane are hereby appointed Commissioners appointed.  
commissioners, who shall be authorized to receive subscriptions to the said capital stock, at such times and places as they or a majority of them may direct, giving notice thereof in two of the newspapers printed in the county of Susquehanna, for at least twenty days, of the times and places when and where the said subscriptions shall be received; and at the time of subscribing for the said stock, two dollars shall be paid upon each share subscribed for to the commissioners or some of them, which money shall be paid over to the treasurer of the company as soon as one shall be appointed; and that the residue of the subscriptions shall be paid in such instalments, and at such times and places, and to such persons, as the president and directors of Books to be opened.
